CLASS 1 RESIDENTIAL TO LONDON

What an amazing few days Class 1 have had in London, it was a 'jam-packed' 72 hours! The children really enjoyed Windsor Castle, they were all fascinated when we went into St George's Chapel and saw the resting place of the Queen, Henry VIII and Jane Seymour. We did a tour of the state apartments and saw Queen Mary's dolls house, the biggest in the world.

Once we were settled into our rooms at the Youth Hostel, we walked to Franco Manca for pizza. The children were really well-behaved and enjoyed sitting chatting with their friends. Later that evening, we had a games evening in one of the lounges before bedtime.

Tuesday we had a very early start, breakfast was served at 7.30am and we were on the coach by 8.30am. Richard, our driver, was fantastic. He offered to take the children on a sightseeing tour before our first booked activity. He took us to Buckingham Palace, the Houses of Parliament, Westminster Abbey and the London Eye. The rest of the morning was spent at Frameless, Marble Arch. It was an incredible immersive experience, which bombarded your senses with visuals and music. We explored four galleries and our different reactions to the artworks were fascinating. It was a like an oasis of calm, many of the children were really reflective and felt it was like meditation.

Our next stop was Wembley Arena, our tour guide, Billy, was fabulous. He engaged the children from the start and was really knowledgeable. Everyone was so excited when we went into the changing rooms and actually were able to touch 'match worn' kit and boots. They were particularly excited to see boots that Harry Kane had scored a hat-trick with! We got to walk out of the tunnel to the pitch, sit in the press room and go into the Royal Box and down the Royal Staircase. It was a memorable afternoon that will stay with the children for many years to come. Billy told them all about the preparations for the FA Cup Final this weekend and it was so interesting seeing behind the scenes preparing for such a large-scale match.

Tuesday evening, we enjoyed dinner at Frankie and Benny's before going to see The Lion King at The Lyceum Theatre. We had excellent seats and, once again, the children's reactions to the show were a pleasure to see. Our final stop was Legoland, on the way home on Wednesday. Children enjoyed going on the rides and made the most of the morning there.

All the children were fantastic, they were super representatives of the school and we hope we have created lasting memories they will carry with them for many years to come. Thank you to Miss Brown, Ms Winsor and Mrs Rose for working hard and making the trip possible, and a special thank you to our Governors, Mr Jem Squires and Mrs Liz Price-Holden for supporting the staff team so well.





CLASS 3 VISIT TO SHALDON ZOO


