CHRISTMAS SHOW AT THE LANGSTONE CLIFF HOTEL



ATTENDANCE

Attendance so far this year is currently 96.1%, if we break that down into days it equates to 169 lost days of learning missed so far this year! Studies have proven that being in school is crucial to your child's educational outcomes and supports better mental health and wellbeing. Please avoid taking your child out of school during term time, as absences will not be authorised. May we also remind you that the gate closes at 8.55am and if your child is late we will need you to complete a late arrival slip in the office, we aim to have the register done by 9.05am so learning can start promptly. You will receive an attendance letter in the last week of term, please contact the office if you have specific issues you would like to discuss.
