YEAR 6 PERFORM DISNEYS THE LION KING







We are excited to share the fantastic work of Class 2 in their Design Technology project this week. Under Miss Buttree's guidance, our young engineers tackled the STEM Primary Engineers Rail Programme, building moving trains in pairs. They honed skills like sawing, measuring, and creating circuits, while developing their innovation and teamwork abilities.

The results were impressive – all trains could move forwards and backwards! It was a joy to see our students so engaged, testing their creations with enthusiasm. This hands-on experience is just one way we're nurturing future innovators at Cockwood School, where we continue to cultivate the inventors and problem solvers of the future!

CLASS 2 ERUPT THEIR VOLCANOES!

We had a fabulous afternoon of fun, when Class 2 took their volcanoes down on the field to see if we could make them erupt. The children had created and built their models at the end of the Spring Term, using salt dough around a plastic bottle. They were all very excited to see if mixing bicarbonate of soda, washing up liquid and white vinegar would have the desired effect! They tested out various adaptions in the quantities until we were happy with the amount of lava it created. We also talked about the various things we could do to improve our outcomes if we did it again, such as add red food dye to make it look more realistic. It was a super afternoon, all the children were really engaged in their learning and making lots of great scientific predictions. Well done Class 2.

Reading will remain a focus throughout the school next year, as we know that being able to read underpins all other learning. We are delighted to share we have had outstanding results in Reading across the school this.

We had **80%** of pupils meet the expected level in Phonics, **90%** of pupils met the expected level in Year 2 and an AMAZING **94%** reached the expected standard in Year 6 SATs.

The Accelerated Reading is just one of tools we use to promote, increase and track reading across the school. Teachers deliver high-quality Guided Reading, Whole Class reading and this year we have had a focus on Reading for Pleasure. The money invested in the library has also played its part and all of these pieces of the jigsaw come together to give us such wonderful end of year and key stage outcomes. Thank you for reading at home with your child, it is such a vital thing you can do to support your child's learning journey and we are so grateful for your continued help.

ATTENDANCE

Up to the start of this week, we have finished on an average of 96% attendance across the academic year, which is fantastic! The national average is currently, 94.2%. Thank you to everyone working hard to ensure their children are in school every day. This term we have 32 with 100% attendance, and across the year we are proud to say we have 9 pupils who haven't missed one day all year! INCREDIBLE- well done.
